THE SECOND QUARTER 2023

COMMENT FROM THE CEO OF ELLOS GROUP AB (PUBL)

STRONG PROFIT IMPROVEMENT

Ellos Group delivered strong profit improvement for the year's second quarter, a period marked by a continued challenging market and an overall challenging situation for household finances.

The profit improvement was driven by margin growth, with a 2.5 percentage point gross margin increase and a 2.1 percentage point selling expenses decrease in relation to sales, as compared with last year. This is a clear indication that our focus on efficiency improvements and cost savings is starting to take effect.

Cost efficiency will remain a prioritised area for Ellos Group's management.

This is particularly important as we are seeing a continued decline in demand for the market as a whole, with purchasing power dampened by high inflation, sharply rising interest rates and some movement towards brick-and-mortar shopping in the wake of the pandemic. The Swedish Trade Federation's E-commerce Indicator estimates that e-commerce in Sweden decreased 4 per cent for the January – July period as compared with last year. Our organic net sales decreased 2.2 per cent compared with Q2 2022 and 2.6 per cent compared with first half-year 2022. The E-commerce Indicator estimates a decrease of 20-40 per cent for home furnishings and furniture in the period January - July. In this context, our home offer holds a strong position.

Efforts to adapt inventory and purchasing to the new macroeconomic situation have continued. At the end of the quarter, the inventory was SEK 93 million lower than the previous year, which corresponds to a reduction of 12 per cent. Cash flow from operating activities increased to SEK 26 million during the quarter, despite rising interest rates.

We continue to implement our strategy to increase focus on our offer to our core customers — women in mid-life. Private label sales are a key element of this strategy, representing 65 per cent of Group sales. In times like these, having attractive, sustainable and affordable offers becomes even more important. Ellos launched several successful swimwear and summer dress collections during the quarter, with styles, ranges and sizes that few operators can offer.

We invested in our platform last year to effectively scale private label sales in selected European marketplaces. We now reach eight markets in Europe with our Fashion and Home Furnishing offers, which include Zalando and Westwing. The sales trend in these markets reinforces our conviction that our private labels provide us with a strong, competitive offer.

Our strategy also includes a continued focus on our payment solutions. We have consolidated our payment solutions under the Elpy brand, which has been rolled out incrementally across our e-commerce sites. We have also established Elpy as a new business area in the Group and have recruited a new Business Area Manager, who reports directly to me, to join the Group Management team.

Sustainability remains a key, prioritised area for Ellos Group and our industry. We focused during the quarter on consolidating our supplier base to improve collaboration with selected suppliers on CSR and environmental issues, and on increasing follow-up and transparency across the value chain. We believe this consolidation will also produce economies of scale and improve our negotiating position with suppliers. With increasing ESG reporting requirements, Ellos Group has signed an agreement with Worldfavor for a digital solution that helps identify the company's impact and supply chain transparency. During the quarter, we also published our annual sustainability report, detailing our progress in 2022 and our sustainability priorities for 2023.

In the current situation, we are closely monitoring market developments. Improving our cost efficiency and continuing to invest in our core customers are our focus areas for 2023 and are prerequisites for our continued competitiveness. As a leading e-commerce player with strong home furnishing and fashion brands, we have no doubt about the industry's favourable long-term conditions, and we are confident about the future.

SECOND QUARTER 2023

SALES

Net sales for the period amounted to SEK 802.1 (858.4) million which is a decrease of 6.6 % compared to last year. The organic growth, i.e. excluding exchange rate changes and dispose of operations (Stayhard) were -2.2 %.

GROSS PROFIT

Gross profit for the period amounted to SEK 430.3 (442.4) million which is a increase of 12.1 million compared to last year. The quarter's gross margin amounted to 53.6% (51.5%) where the increase is explained by a strengthened product margin.

OPERATING COSTS

Selling expenses amounted to SEK 304.0 (346.7) million which is a decrease of SEK 42.7 million compared to last year. In relation to net sales, selling expenses dereased by 2.5 percentage point mainly due to an improved marketing efficiency. Selling expenses include amortization of acquisition-related intangible assets of SEK 23.6 (23.6) million.

Administrative expenses, which in the quarter amounted to SEK 115.9 (84.6) million increased by SEK 31.3 million mainly due to the pension adjustments made in the previous year.

Other income amounted to SEK 4.5 (3.6) million and other costs to SEK -1.1 (-16.4) million. The improvement compared to previous year is FX related.

ADJUSTED EBITA

Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 41.3 (8.4) million which means a increase of SEK 32.9 million compared with the corresponding period last year.

EBITA

EBITA amounted to SEK 37.4 (22.0) million which is an increase of SEK 15.4 million compared with the same period last year.

FINANCIAL ITEMS AND TAXES

Financial income amounted to SEK 3.3 (5.6) million and financial expenses amounted to SEK -99.9 (-62.2) million. The increase in financial expenses are explained by increased interest costs for the group's external credits and for the debt the group has to group companies. This debt is converted to SEK, which means that a currency adjustment also affected the financial expenses.

Income tax for the period amounted to SEK 0.8 (-3.3) million.

NET PROFIT

Net profit for the period amounted to SEK -82.0 (-61.6) million.

CASH FLOW

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 25.8 (16.8) million. The cash flow includes bond loan interest expenses amounting to SEK 36.2 (25.3) million.

Inventories increased during the quarter by SEK 22.2 (22.3) million, which had a negative effect on cash flow.

Accounts payable increased during the quarter by SEK 23.1 (49.1) million and has had a positive effect on cash flow.

Cash flow from investments totalled SEK -8.1 (-9.0) million, where the biggest part of it was related to commercial development projects.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -20.2 (-9.2) million and mainly referred to changes in the group's revolving credit and lease liability.

Cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 156.3 (156.7) million.

Cash flow for the period totalled SEK -2.5 (-1.4) million.



SIX MONTHS 2023

SALES

Net sales for the period amounted to SEK 1 618.5 (1 721.0) million which is a decrease of 6.0 % compared to last year. The organic growth, i.e. excluding exchange rate changes and dispose of operations (Stayhard) were -2.6 %.

GROSS PROFIT

Gross profit for the period amounted to SEK 845.8 (887.0) million which is a decrease of 41.2 million compared to last year. The gross margin increased by 0.8 percentage points compared with the same period last year and amounted to 52.3 (51.5) %.

OPERATING COSTS

Selling expenses amounted to SEK 625.7 (684.4) million which is a decrease of SEK 58.7 million compared to last year. In relation to net sales, selling expenses decreased by 1.1 percentage point due to decreased marketing costs. Selling expenses include amortization of acquisition-related intangible assets of SEK 47.3 (47.3) million.

Administrative expenses, which amounted to SEK 225.1 (208.7) million increased by SEK 16.4 million mainly due to the adjustment made in 2022 of the pension costs

Other income amounted to SEK 10.9 (5.1) million and other costs to SEK -9.0 (-24.0) million. The improvement compared to previous year is FX related.

ADJUSTED EBITA

Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 48.1 (23.4) million which means a increase of SEK 24.7 million compared with the corresponding period last year.

EBITA

EBITA amounted to SEK 44.2 (22.3) million which is an increase of SEK 21.9 million compared with the same period last year.

FINANCIAL ITEMS AND TAXES

Financial income amounted to SEK 6.6 (10.4) million and financial expenses amounted to SEK -162.6 (-109.8) million. The increase in financial expenses is explained by increased interest costs for the group's credits and debt to group companies as well as exchange rate loss when recalculating this debt.

Income tax for the period amounted to SEK 4.6 (1.7) million.

NET PROFIT

Net profit for the period amounted to SEK -154.5 (-122.6) million.

CASH FLOW

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -24.3 (-87.1) million. The cash flow includes bond loan interest expenses amounting to SEK 69.0 (51.2) million.

Inventories dereased during the period by SEK -0.8 (53.6) million, which had a positive effect on cash flow.

Accounts payable dereased during the period by SEK -55.1 (-66.4) million and has had a negative effect on cash flow.

Cash flow from investments totalled SEK -14.5 (-21.7) million, where the biggest part of it was related to commercial development projects.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK 37.6 (69.2) million and mainly referred to changes in the group's revolving credit and lease liability.

Cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 156.3 (156.7) million.

Cash flow for the period totalled SEK -1.2 (-39.6) million.

NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES

As at 30 June 2023, the group had 585 (602) employees.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Group is exposed to several risks, for example in areas such as currency, interest rate and financing as well as competition, the economy and IT security, and these risks can affect operations and earnings. The risks that have been identified are described in the Group's annual report for 2022 on pages 6, 12 and 42-44.

The worldwide situation means that there is great uncertainty linked to consumer purchasing power due to high inflation, rising interest rates and a general concern driven by the geopolitical situation.

PLEDGED ASSETS

The group's assets pledged as collateral for financing from Swedbank AB (publ) and the issued bond are unchanged compared with 31 December 2022 and is described in the Group's annual report for 2022 on page 67.

CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

During 2021 the Group has received a decision following an ongoing tax audit in the subsidiary Ellos Finland OY. The remark refers to whether VAT is to be levied in the company's financial operations and refers to the years 2018 and 2019. This decision has been appealed, and the Group believes that there are good opportunities for a positive outcome. Further information can be found in the Group's annual report for 2022 on page 67.

PARENT COMPANY

The Parent Company's operating profit/loss for the second quarter amounted to SEK 0.1 (0.1) million. The Parent Company's income consists of intra-group services and the main costs was insurance costs, consultant costs and board fees. Net financial income/expense amounted to SEK -94.2 (-48.4) million for the second quarter and primarily comprised interest on issued bonds as well as interest and the exchange rate loss that occurred during recalculation of current liabilities to group companies.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 General information

Ellos Group AB (publ). corporate identity number 559175-1325 is a limited company registered in Sweden with registered office in Stockholm. The Company's address is PO Box 961. 501 10 Borås.

Ellos Group AB is a subsidiary of Cidron e-Com S.à r.l., B164334. 8 rue Lou Hemmer L-1748 Senningerberg, Luxemburg.

Unless otherwise stated, all amounts are shown in SEK millions.

Note 2 Significant accounting policies

General information

The consolidated financial statements for Ellos Group AB (publ) have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) as adopted by the EU and issued by International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) and interpretations issued by the IFRS Interpretations Committee (IFRIC). Furthermore, the group also applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation. RFR 1 Supplementary Accounting Rules for groups. This interim report has been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting.

Applied accounting principles in the interim report are consistent with the accounting principles that were applied in the preparation of the consolidated and annual report 2022.

New and changed amendments together with new interpretations which come into effect on 1 January 2023 may regarding changes in IAS 1 and IAS 12 affect the information that Ellos Group provides in its financial reports.

Accounting principles for the parent company

The Parent Company applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2 Accounting for Legal Entities.

Application of RFR 2 means the Parent Company must, as far as possible, apply all IFRS adopted by the EU within the framework of the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Pension Obligations Vesting Act. and consider the relationship between accounting and taxation.

Note 3 Significant estimates and judgements

The preparation of an interim report requires management to make assessments and estimates as well as assumptions that affect the application of the accounting principles and reported amounts for assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual outcome may deviate from these estimates and judgments.

Important estimates and assessments made by the company management appear from the annual report for 2022 on pages 40-41.

Note 4 Transactions with related parties

Transactions, for the parent company and the group, with related parties are currently of the same nature as described in the annual report for 2022 for Ellos Group AB.

Note 5 Fair value financial instruments

The group's financial instruments measured at fair value as at 30 June 2023 comprise currency derivatives. Derivatives contracts with positive values amounted to SEK 31.7 (110.2) million and derivative contracts with negative values amounted to SEK 49.4 (47.2) million. Derivatives transactions are accounted for at gross value.

Financial assets and financial liabilities valued at fair value in the balance sheet (derivatives) are categorizedaccording to the three-level fair value hierarchy in IFRS 13 (Level 1. 2 or 3). Measurement of all currency derivatives is categorized in Level 2. Currency futures are valued based on observable information regarding the currency rates and market interest rates as at the rates and market interest rates as at the balance sheet date for the remaining term.
