THE FIRST QUARTER 2024

- Net sales decreased by 5.7 % to SEK 770,0 (816.4) million. Organically, net sales decreased by 5.3 %.
- The gross margin increased to 40.6 (39.5) %.
- Adjusted EBITA* increased to SEK 20.2 (6.8) million. The adjusted EBITA margin* increased to 2.6 (0.8) %.
- The operating profit/loss* increased to SEK -3.4 (-16.8) million. The operating margin* increased to -0.4 (-2.1) %.
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -252.3 (-48.8) million.
- Adjusted cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -108.0 (-48.8) million.
- Inventories amounted to SEK 651.0 (676.8) million.

COMMENT FROM THE CEO OF ELLOS GROUP AB (PUBL)

ELLOS GROUP STARTS OFF 2024 WITH STRONG EARNINGS IMPROVEMENT

Ellos Group delivers another quarter with improved earnings and continues to demonstrate a stable financial development. Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 20.2 million, a year-on-year improvement of almost 200 per cent, and corresponding to a margin of 2.6 per cent. As in 2023, the focus in 2024 will be on sharpening our customer offer while working to improve efficiency and costs.

The quarter presented a challenging market environment. Consumer purchasing power remained subdued, particularly in home furnishing, and an unusually cold spring impacted demand for more seasonal clothing. The Easter holiday, which fell early this year, had a somewhat dampening effect during the first quarter, and we expect this to have a more positive impact during Q2.

In the context of this development, Ellos Group's Home Furnishing and Fashion offers stand strong, and our assessment is that we are defending and continuing to gain market share. Our total sales during the first quarter decreased 5 per cent. However, we see positive indications in April for the spring and summer season, with preliminary figures for April showing sales growth of approximately 3 per cent.

Our strategy of focusing on our core customers guides us in everything we do. At the beginning of the year we advanced our positions in several areas to further improve our customer offer. We introduced the new Ellos Studio initiative, offering sport- and leisurewear in the 'Women's Sport' segment. Ellos launched several successful campaigns in collaboration with Pernilla Wahlgren, with a focus on fashion and home furnishings. We also intensified our focus on underwear, swimwear and beauty.

Within Home Furnishings, we have focused on developing attractive entry-level products. Both Ellos and Jotex have developed offers focused on design and quality that give customers hard-to-beat value for money in the lower price ranges. Jotex Tailormade was launched early in the year, and we have progressively increased the exposure of this offer with customised curtains for our customers in the Nordics and Northern Europe. Ellos, Jotex and Homeroom continue to promote 'Kitchen & Coffee', our offer focusing on kitchen, tableware, food and party experiences.

The first quarter earnings improvement was achieved due to a higher gross margin, lower marketing costs and lower operating costs. Efficiency improvements and a focus on costs are top priorities in all of our markets, and this work will continue unabated in 2024.

Inventories totalled SEK 651 million at the close of the quarter, as compared with SEK 677 million in 2023 and SEK 770 million two years ago. We are thus maintaining a well-balanced inventory position, providing us with favourable conditions for our spring and summer collections once the weather changes.

We have laid a solid foundation for 2024, with a popular offer and a broad-based business model based on our fully integrated online platform. We intend to continue as we have been by continuously improving our offer to our core customers in parallel with maintaining focus on increasing efficiency, reducing costs and improving cash flow.

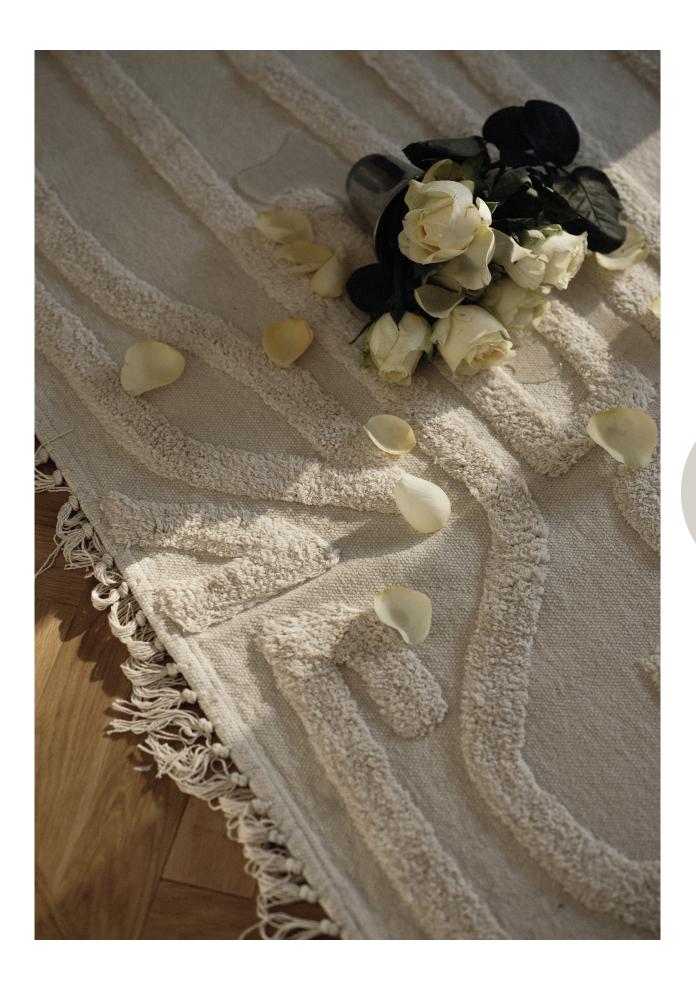
In April we saw positive signs of a moderate recovery in demand which, in combination with potential future relief in the form of interest rate cuts, makes us cautiously optimistic. At the same time, we are closely following market developments, not least given the prevailing geopolitical turmoil.

In closing, I would like to thank all of our fantastic Ellos Group customers and colleagues, not least our bondholders for their continued support. We maintain an ongoing dialogue with various stakeholders to ensure our long-term financing. A strategic review is underway in order to create the best possible conditions and capital structure to enable the company to take the next step in its development.

As a leading Nordic shopping destination for home furnishings and fashion, we at Ellos Group are well positioned to continue our positive and profitable journey.

FIRST QUARTER 2024

SALES

Net sales for the period amounted to SEK 770.0 (816.4) million which is a decrease of 5.7 % compared to last year. The organic growth, i.e. excluding exchange rate changes and dispose of operations (Stayhard) were -5.3 %.

GROSS PROFIT

Starting with the Annual Report for 2023, the costs for package distribution are reported in cost of goods sold. The comparison quarters are recalculated. Gross profit for the period amounted to SEK 312.7 (322.5) million which is a decrease of 9.8 million compared to last year. The quarter's gross margin increased to 40.6% (39.5%).

OPERATING COSTS

Selling expenses, which no longer include distribution costs, amounted to SEK 204.0 (229.4) million which is a decrease of SEK 25.4 million compared to last year. In relation to net sales, selling expenses dereased by 1.6 percentage point mainly due to an improved marketing efficiency, but also a good cost development in customer center and the closure of the store in Gothenburg had a positive effect. Selling expenses include amortization of acquisition-related intangible assets of SEK 23.6 (23.6) million.

Administrative expenses, which in the quarter amounted to SEK 112.5 (108.4) million increased by SEK 4.1 million mainly driven by provision for variable salary components.

Other income amounted to SEK 4.4 (6.4) million and other costs to SEK -4.0 (-7.9) million. The change compared to previous year is mainly explained by exchange rate differences.

ADJUSTED EBITA

Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 20.2 (6.8) million which means a increase of SEK 13.4 million compared with the corresponding period last year.

EBITA

EBITA amounted to SEK 20.2 (6.8) million which is an increase of SEK 13.4 million compared with the same period last year.

FINANCIAL ITEMS AND TAXES

Financial income amounted to SEK 4.8 (3.2) million and financial expenses amounted to SEK -107.0 (-63.0) million. The increase of the financial income is mainly explained by currency adjustment of short-term liabilities to group companies, costs for emission of a SEK 250 million bond and increased interest costs.

Income tax for the period amounted to SEK 5.0 (3.9) million.

NET PROFIT

Net profit for the period amounted to SEK -100.6 (-72.7) million, wherethe change is explained by increased financial costs.

CASH FLOW

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -252.3 (-48.8) million. Cash flow has been negatively affected by SEK 144.3 million due to that the corresponding funds are used as security for the group's issued bank guarantees and FX derivatives and thus are not reported as cash & cash equivalents but as other current receivables. The cash flow includes bond loan interest expenses amounting to SEK 41.6 (32.8) million.

Inventories increased during the quarter by SEK 29.7 (-23.1) million, which had a negative effect on cash flow. The inventory thus amounts to SEK 651.0 million, which can be compared with SEK 676.8 million one year ago and SEK 769.9 million two years ago.

Accounts payable decreased during the quarter by SEK -83.7 (-78.2) million and has had a negative effect on cash flow.

Cash flow from investments totalled SEK -4.3 (-6.4) million, where the biggest part of it was related to commercial development projects.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK 207.0 (56.5) million and mainly referred to a new super senior bond of SEK 250 million.

Cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 101.5 (158.8) million.

Cash flow for the period totalled SEK -49.6 (1.3) million.



SIGNIFICANT EVENTS DURING THE FIRST QUARTER

On February 9, a super senior secured bond was issued with a fixed interest rate of SEK 250 million and with a maturity of 365 days. The settlement from the emission were used to fully refinance the previous revolving credit facility. The company's senior secured bonds of SEK 1,500 million mature in July 2024, and the Group is working to ensure the financing of these credits as well.

EVENTS AFTER CLOSING DATE

The Tax Agency denied, in the tax return for the year 2020, Ellos AB deduction for costs amounting to SEK 158 million regarding a collaboration with former group companies. The case was appealed by Ellos Group and the Administrative Court announced in a judgment during April 2024 that they cancel the Tax Agency's decision and admit Ellos AB deductions for these costs.

NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES

As at 31 March 2024, the group had 557 (603) employees.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Group is exposed to several risks, for example in areas such as currency, interest rate and financing as well as competition, the economy and IT security, and these risks can affect operations and earnings.

The risks that have been identified are described in the Group's annual report for 2023 on pages 6, 12 and 36-38.

The worldwide situation means that there is great uncertainty linked to consumer purchasing power due to the macroeconomic situation and a general concern driven by the geopolitical situation.

PLEDGED ASSETS

The group has issued bonds for SEK 1 750 million. As security for these credits the group has pledged the shares in all of the group's subsidiaries and sub-subsidiaries.

There are also business mortgages in some of the group companies amounting to SEK 8 560.4 million. Furthermore, the group has pledged SEK 144.3 million cash & cash equivalents for issued bank guarantees and FX derivatives. In addition, the group has a general guarantee which amounts to SEK 1 750.0 million.

PARENT COMPANY

The Parent Company's operating profit/loss for the first quarter amounted to SEK 0.0 (0.0) million. The Parent Company's income consists of intra-group services and the main costs was insurance costs, consultant costs and board fees. Net financial income/expense amounted to SEK -92.5 (-56.0) million for the first quarter and primarily comprised interest on issued bonds, interest and currency effect on current liabilities to group companies as well as costs for emission of the new super senior bond on SEK 250 million.

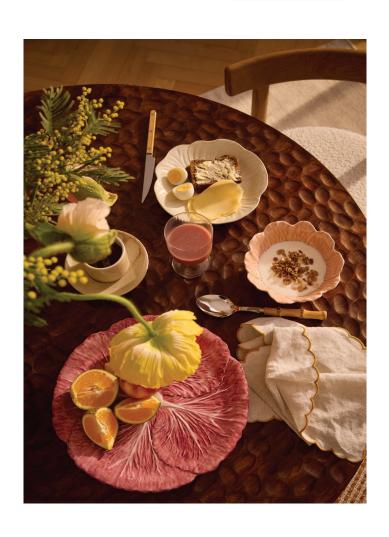

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 General information

Ellos Group AB (publ). corporate identity number 559175-1325 is a limited company registered in Sweden with registered office in Stockholm. The Company's address is PO Box 961. 501 10 Borås.

Ellos Group AB is a subsidiary of Cidron e-Com S.à r.l., B164334. 8 rue Lou Hemmer L-1748 Senningerberg, Luxemburg.

Unless otherwise stated, all amounts are shown in SEK millions.

Note 2 Significant accounting policies

General information

The consolidated financial statements for Ellos Group AB (publ) have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) as adopted by the EU and issued by International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) and interpretations issued by the IFRS Interpretations Committee (IFRIC). Furthermore, the group also applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation. RFR 1 Supplementary Accounting Rules for groups. This interim report has been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting.

Applied accounting principles in the interim report are consistent with the accounting principles that were applied in the preparation of the consolidated and annual report 2023.

Accounting principles for the parent company

The Parent Company applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2 Accounting for Legal Entities.

Application of RFR 2 means the Parent Company must, as far as possible, apply all IFRS adopted by the EU within the framework of the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Pension Obligations Vesting Act. and consider the relationship between accounting and taxation.

Note 3 Significant estimates and judgements

The preparation of an interim report requires management to make assessments and estimates as well as assumptions that affect the application of the accounting principles and reported amounts for assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual outcome may deviate from these estimates and judgments.

Important estimates and assessments made by the company management appear from the annual report for 2023 on pages 34-35.

Note 4 Transactions with related parties

Transactions, for the parent company and the group, with related parties are currently of the same nature as described in the annual report for 2023 for Ellos Group AB.

Note 5 Fair value financial instruments

The group's financial instruments measured at fair value as at 31 March 2024 comprise currency derivatives. Derivatives contracts with positive values amounted to SEK 20.2 (36.7) million and derivative contracts with negative values amounted to SEK 16.4 (45.0) million. Derivatives transactions are accounted for at gross value.

Financial assets and financial liabilities valued at fair value in the balance sheet (derivatives) are categorizedaccording to the three-level fair value hierarchy in IFRS 13 (Level 1. 2 or 3). Measurement of all currency derivatives is categorized in Level 2. Currency futures are valued based on observable information regarding the currency rates and market interest rates as at the rates and market interest rates as at the balance sheet date for the remaining term.
